

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF PINECREST, FLORIDA, EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE SNAPPER CREEK CANAL SHARED USE PATH PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Village Council adopted Resolution 2021-46 on June 8, 2021, adopting the 2021 Strategic Plan, including to design and construct the 67 Avenue Shared Use Path to create a link with the Snapper Creek Trail that connects to the Underline, Ludlam Trail and Old Cutler Trail; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council supports the continuation of shared use path facilities northward beyond the Village's jurisdiction into the unincorporated area, linking the Village's Ludlam Shared Use Path to the Underline and offering a chance to connect to the Ludlam Trail in the future, which starts at 80 Street between 69 and 70 Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council instructed the Village Manager to seek alternative funding sources for large scale capital projects;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF PINECREST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Village Council hereby expresses support for the development of the *Snapper Creek Canal Shared Use Path Project* from SW 136 Street north to the future Snapper Creek (C-2) canal pocket park adjacent to the Snapper Creek canal bridge and authorizes the Village Manager to seek grant funding in support of the project.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

RE: Resolution in Support of the Snapper Creek Canal Shared Use Path Project

The Village Council authorized the design of the Ludlam Road Shared Use Path Project which plans a shared use path from SW 136 Street north to the future Snapper Creek (C-2) canal pocket park adjacent to the Snapper Creek canal bridge.

The attached resolution expresses Village Council's support for the continuation of shared use path facilities northward beyond the Village's jurisdiction into the unincorporated area. This proposed future project would connect the Village's Ludlam Shared Use Path all the way to the Underline. The proposed Snapper Creek Canal Shared Use Path Project will also provide a future opportunity to connect to the Ludlam Trail which begins at 80 Street between 69 Avenue and 70 Avenue.

It is anticipated that the design and construction costs for the proposed Snapper Creek Canal Shared Use Path from the bridge to US 1 will be \$820,000. The Village will seek project funding through the County Transportation Planning Organization and the Florida Department of Transportation.
