RE: Rotary Club of Pinecrest

For over a year, representatives from the Rotary Club of Miami Dadeland Pinecrest have been in contact with Mayor Corradino and myself regarding the possibility of partnering with the Village to help revitalize the area chapter, which has been declining in membership over the years. Rotary International is an international service organization whose stated purpose is to bring together business and professional leaders in order to provide humanitarian service and to advance goodwill and peace around the world. Putting "service above self, this organization is a non-political and non-sectarian organization open to all people regardless of race, color, creed, religion, gender, or political preference. There are 34,282 member clubs worldwide, and 1.2 million individuals, known as Rotarians.

Recently renamed the Rotary Club of Pinecrest, organization leaders have inquired if the Village would be willing to host its bi-monthly meetings at Evelyn Greer Park. Further, as a service organization, the Rotary Club of Pinecrest has committed to working with the Village to identify service projects within Pinecrest, and to also participate in special projects involving other clubs in the tri-county area. Preliminary discussions have revolved around projects that increase access to people with disabilities at Pinecrest Gardens.

At this time, I respectfully request that the Council agree to waive the rental fees (\$350 per month) associated with the bi-monthly use of the multipurpose room at Evelyn Greer Park.
